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BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING MINUTES

FEBRUARY 26th, 2024

OPENING OF MEETING: Chairperson Smith called a regular business meeting of the Board of Supervisors to order at 7:05 p.m. on Monday, February 26th, 2024, in the Public Meeting Room of the Township of Spring Administration Building, located at 2850 Windmill Road, Spring Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania.

ROLL CALL: Upon roll call, Supervisors Smith, Stuck, Kocher, Royer, and Wertz were present. Also present were John Groller, Mary Rossi, Jen Bensinger, Jeremy Baez-Reyes, Judy Houck, Paul Darrah, Jim Moll, Jason Reichert, Aaron Wozniak, Chief Powell, Daniel Becker; Esq, Dean Murray, Jennifer Murray, and Chazz Alden from Representative Johanny Cepeda-Freytiz's office. Chief Hackman attended via ZOOM.

ANNOUNCEMENT:

Ms. Smith stated that an Executive Session was held prior to this meeting to discuss personnel matters.

AGENDA AMENDMENTS: None

OPEN TO THE FLOOR:

Chazz Alden, from Representative Johanny Cepeda-Freytiz's office, said they are holding a Women's Resource Fair this Saturday, March 2nd, at the Romanian Community Center on West Lawn Avenue. Mr. Alden said that more residents have been utilizing their office hours (1st and 3rd Friday mornings) at the Township, especially for the Property Tax Rebate Program.

- 3. Turf Fertilization/Weed Control 2024 Contract Award
 Ms. Houck recommended that the Board award the Contract to Tomlinson Bomberger
 Lawn Care and Landscape, Inc. of Lancaster, PA, in the amount of \$12,071.00. The
 project is being coordinated through PA CoStars.
- 4. Formal Offer of Employment-Assistant Manager/Facilities Director Mr. Groller stated that Dean Murray has completed all background screenings and recommends the Board extend a formal offer of full-time employment to Mr. Murray at a starting salary of \$110,000.00. Mr. Murray's official start date is Monday, March 25th, 2024.

Mr. Murray said he and his wife thank the Board for the opportunity and look forward to getting to know everyone.

5. Management Development Program
Mr. Groller recommended that the Board approve the Management Development
Program through the Township's HR Consultant, Paragon Consulting Group, LLC.
The program cost is \$5,500.00 per month.

6. EWO-WWTP Belt Press Program

Mr. Darrah requested the Board's approval for the Screw Press Design, Permitting, and Bidding proposed by Entech Engineering, Inc. in the amount of \$35,165.00. Mr. Darrah stated that the Township received a \$475,000.00 grant for the project. Mr. Darrah said the project is going out to bid in the next several weeks and recommends purchasing the press immediately due to price increases and a 26-week lead time for delivery.

7. Authorization to Bid 2024 Roadwork Project-Tabled-No Action Mr. Darrah noted the list of roads for the proposed slurry seal. Mr. Darrah said the roads are down to one (1) development in the Township that will qualify for slurry seal as maintenance work is all caught up. This list still needs to be finalized, with Mr. Darrah noting that course samples need to be done and that on Reading Boulevard, he would like to do recycling reclamation, which would significantly lower the bid price. Mr. Darrah confirmed for Mr. Stuck areas in the Township where recycling reclamation was done previously.

Mr. Groller said staff and the Road Engineer would review, obtain additional information, and return for authorization from the Board.

8. Authorization of Purchase Order WWTP 2024-13
Mr. Darrah requested approval to purchase the RAS (return activated sludge) Pump from the George KELSO Company in the amount of \$10,305.00, noting the company is a CoStars Vendor. Mr. Darrah confirmed for Mr. Stuck that the price does not include installation and that Township staff will install it.

ACTION ITEMS FOR APPROVAL: (Continued)

Mr. Darrah confirmed for Mr. Stuck that other material rather than steel is not an option and noted the damage from the 2013 flooding.

Motion to approve Action Items #1-6,& #8 was made by Mr. Kocher and seconded by Mr. Wertz. Upon roll call, all Supervisors present voted affirmatively. Mr. Wertz abstained from voting on Action Item #1 and Fire Fund #14 payment. Mr. Stuck and Ms. Smith abstained from voting on Action Item #5 and payment of check #110882. MOTION CARRIED

- A. Zoning/Building Codes Department-Mr. Stuck questioned if the Township has any recourse to address dead trees along the road. Mr. Wozniak confirmed the Township's Ordinance states that any diseased or dying trees can be ordered to be removed within thirty (30) days. Mr. Becker stated if the Township believes it is a health and safety issue, the Township can order it removed, and if the tree is in the right-of-way, the Township must offer the wood to the property owner.
